



## A Celebration of Life Kaye Stone

Kaye Janet Stone of McPherson, Kansas passed away peacefully on Friday, October 25th, 2024, at the age of 79, surrounded by her loved ones at Wesley Medical Center in Wichita, Kansas.

Originally native to the State of Colorado, Kaye was born on August 4th, 1945, in Denver, the daughter of Harry and Sylvia Tzivia (Daschut) Friedman, herself a firstgeneration American of Ukrainian ancestry.

From beginning to end, Kaye's life revolved around a ceaseless dedication to her family and loved ones.
