

Charlotte D. "Charlie" Levens, 96, passed away on Sunday, December 8, 2024, in Salina, KS. She was born August 26, 1928, in rural Galva, KS, the daughter of Willis F. and Ida Marie (Christensen) Scott. She attended Grasshopper Country School and graduated from Galva High School in 1946. Upon graduation, she worked at the McPherson Woolworth from 1947 to 1955.

Charlotte was united in marriage to U.S. Air Force Staff Sergeant Joseph D. Levens on September 4, 1955, in McPherson, KS. Joe was from Alabama and stationed at Schilling Air Force Base. They were living in Salina when he died on May 8, 1963. She moved with their two children, Joseph, Jr. and Rita, to McPherson where she worked at Sid Bacon Motors for two years before spending 26 years at the McPherson Sentinel. She retired in 1993 as Circulation Manager.
