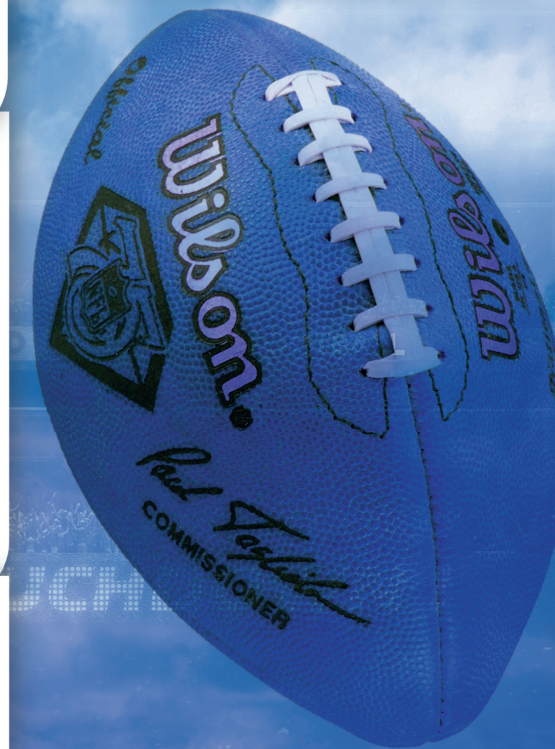
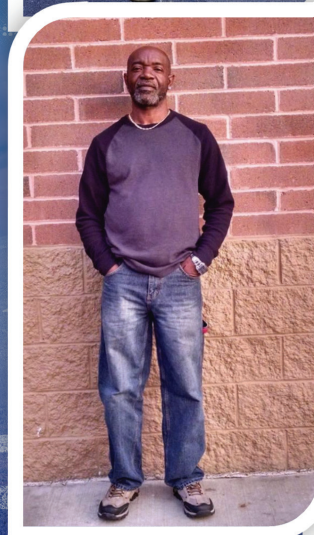
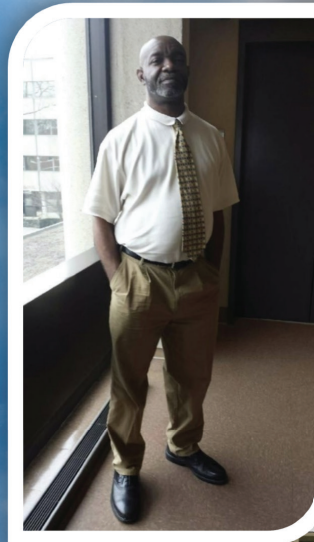
Steve, as he was affectionately known, accepted Christ into his life at an early age. He joined Countyline Missionary Baptist Church of Sasser, GA.
