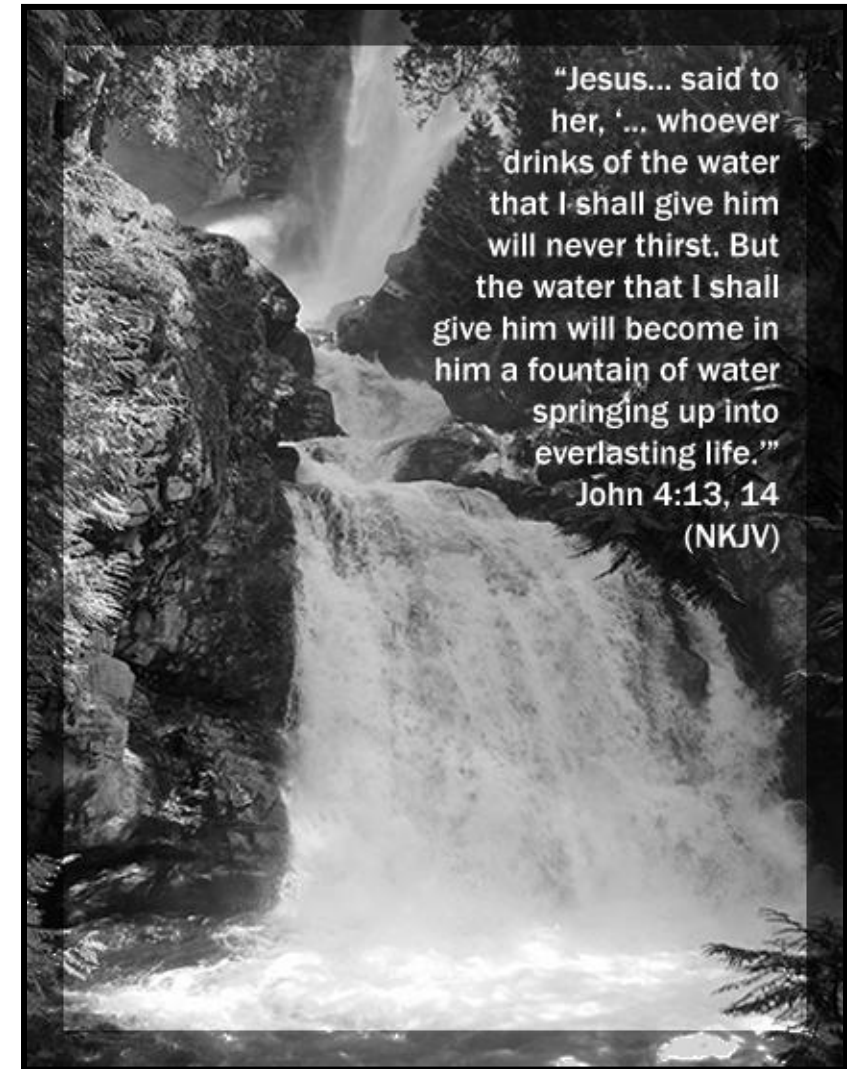

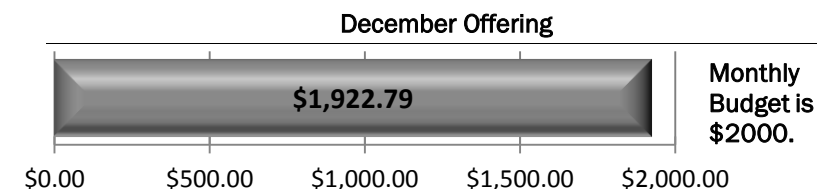

- ❄ **Nature Nugget:** Silk is a high-performance, protein-based fiber made by some invertebrates. Folks have employed the silk of the silk moth in fabric for over 4,000 years. Spiders also produce silk. The type they use for webs and safety lines is called dragline silk. It is stronger than steel and tougher than Kevlar. Scientists have not produced a material that performs as well as spiders’ silk.* God gave these creatures special, useful tools. “The spider skillfully grasps with its hands, and it is in kings’ palaces.” Proverbs 30:28 (NKJV).
