

Willie John Mitchell, Jr. was born on January 11, 1946, in Savannah, GA to his wonderful and loving parents, Willie John and Madlin Mitchell, who instilled in him at a very early age the need for education and the love and loyalty for his family and friends.

Butch attended elementary school at East Broad Street School. Later, he attended and graduated from Sol C. Johnson High School where he played his favorite sport, football. He was a member of the graduating class of 1964. Following his high school graduation, he continued his education at Savannah State College (now University) where he obtained his bachelor's degree in Business Administration and graduated with the class of 1968. At a young age, he was Baptized and Confirmed in St. Matthew's Episcopal Church where he often served as an Acolyte.

After graduating from Savannah State College, he was off to New York City to live with family and to pursue his career in Business Administration. He was asked to be part of the modeling industry. Years later, he moved to Chicago to continue his work with various corporate employers such as Seagram's and Herman Miller.

Among his many life's accomplishments, he was most proud to have pledged Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., Delta Eta Chapter, in the Spring of 1965 at Savannah State College. He was also a member of the Savannah State College Men's Glee Club. He was also inducted into the Sol C. Johnson Athletic Hall of Fame. He loved projects that involved working with our daddy especially, restoring dad's antique cars and truck and building the garage and pergola that still stands strong in the backyard of our family home.

In 1995, upon the death of our father, Butch moved back to Savannah to assist with caring for our mother. He became involved with community projects and worked as a chairman and member of the Historic District Board of Review and a member of the Dixon Park Neighborhood Improvement Association. Upon his retirement, he pursued another one of his passions – gardening: such as collard greens, turnips, tomatoes, cucumbers, broccoli, etc.

He will always be remembered for his frank opinions, his wisdom, kindness, strength and as a true friend to those who were fortunate to be part of his life.

Butch was preceded in death by his parents, Willie John Mitchell, Sr and Madlin Mitchell; and a brother, Daniel Henry. He leaves to mourn and cherish his memories his loving sisters, Claudine Mitchell Lee, JoAnne Mitchell, and Sandra Mitchell; nephews, Terry Henry (Tyeshia) and Allen Henry (Lisa) all of Atlanta; and he is also survived by a multitude of cousins and friends who will forever cherish and remember him in their hearts.





















































**Clergy** - Father Arboleda and Deacon Ella Rountree-Davis for your home and hospital room visits to offer Butch prayers, communion, and comfort.
