**Museum of the Bible**  
22 June 2018

Middleham and St. Peter's is sponsoring a bus trip to the Museum of the Bible in Washington D.C.

The Museum of the Bible aims to be among the most technologically advanced and engaging museums in the world. Showcasing rare artifacts spanning 3,500 years of history, the museum offers visitors an immersive and personalized experience with the Bible, and its ongoing impact on the world around us.

**Trip Details:**

- Leave Parish Hall on 22 June at 7:00 AM.
- Arrive at the museum 9:00 AM.
- Return to the bus at 12:00 PM.
- Arrive back at the Parish Hall at 2:00 PM.
- Cost: \$35 for adults and \$30 for children (under 12 years old) covers the bus trip and admission to the museum.
- (Once inside the museum, some exhibits are free and some have an additional admission cost.)

Morning snacks will be provided on the bus. The museum is also home to two Mediterranean-themed restaurants (one table service and one quick service) as well as a coffee shop.

Among the exhibits are the Hebrew Bible Walk-Through, a New Testament Theater, The Impact of the Bible, Translating the Bible into English, the World of Jesus of Nazareth, The Dead Sea Scrolls, and the Bible in American History.

Transportation will be provided by a charter bus that is equipped to handle visitors with mobility concerns.
