During that time, she met Clayton Anderson. They were married on April 28, 1954 at Lands Lutheran Church in Hoffman, Minnesota. They were blessed with four children: Calvin, Gail, Kay and Jan. Ardelle was a stay-at-home mom and helped Clayton with farming. Clayton passed away June 27, 1982 after a battle with cancer. Ardelle continued to live on the farm for a few years. One night at a dance, Ardelle met Wayne Rohloff and they were married in Las Vegas, Nevada on March 17, 1987. They bought a home in Morris, and had two special dogs: Buddy and Mitzi.
