She met many people through her church and made more lifelong friends. Evelyn volunteered her time at the Inwood Library. She would often have puzzle get togethers on Wednesday and after church Sunday. One of her treasured yearly visits was when her sister Betty and husband Jay would come from Custer for a 2-week visit.

In 2017, Evelyn had a fall at her home that sent her to the Fellowship Village in Inwood for rehab. She so enjoyed the home life and friends she made that she decided to stay. She flourished there surrounded by her new family and the activities they provided.

On February 15, 2024, Evelyn had a life altering fall and passed away at Sanford USD Medical Center in Sioux Falls on February 18, 2024 at the age of 79 years. May she rest in peace. God bless a beautiful soul.
