Obituary

On November 1, 2023, Mrs. Delores (Dee) M. Dambeck was called home by our heavenly Father at the age of 86. Delores was born on October 8, 1937 to Willie and Marie Middleton, and at an early age was baptized as a faithful member of Zion White Bluff Missionary Baptist Church.

Delores was educated in the Savannah Public School system attending Haven Home and Beach High School. After graduation she moved to Greenwich, Connecticut where she was one of the first Parking Enforcement Officers employed by the Greenwich Police Department. It was during this time that she met and married the love of her life, Daniel Dambeck. Dee left the police department in 1968 to join her husband in running the family business, Dambeck News Service, where she became the principal owner upon Daniel's death, and successfully managed and operated the News Service until her retirement in 1989.

Delores, while living in Connecticut, joined the First Baptist Church of Greenwich, where she lifted the name of Jesus as a dutiful member of the Church Choir. Upon returning to Savannah, Delores reestablished her membership at Zion White Bluff Missionary Baptist Church spearheading the restoration of the historic Church and serving as the Church's Treasurer until her passing.

Delores is survived by her loving sister, Sallie M. Branch and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends. Delores' interment will be in Greenwich Connecticut next to her loving husband Daniel.
