aren Ann Casale was born in Ortonville, MN, and attended Benilde-St. Margaret's High School in St. Louis Park, MN, before attending the College of St. Teresa in Winona, MN, where she met her future husband, Matt. After they married, Matt and Karen moved to Washington, D.C., where Matt worked at the Pentagon while in the service and Karen worked as an Environmental Health Specialist with the District of Columbia Bureau of Food and Drug. She had the honor of serving as the Health inspector to ensure food safety of an event held at the White House. After Matt fulfilled his time with the Army, they returned home to Minnesota, where Karen went on to serve as an Environmental Health Specialist with the Anoka County Community Health and Environmental Services Department for 45 years.

In addition to her work with Anoka County, Karen was a dedicated and lifetime member of the Minnesota Environmental Health Association (MEHA) for 50 years and served as the Membership Committee Co-Chair. She was one of the first female Environmental Health Specialists in the state of Minnesota and a recipient of MEHA's Frank A. Staffenson Environmental Health Professional of the Year Award in 2003.
