Classroom News

Mrs. Davidson's Class

We are just past the halfway point for first quarter! Mid-term grades went home on Friday; take a look at them and make sure your student is on track for the quarter, and see what they might be missing.

Looking forward to October, we will have several field trips. The trip to the apple orchard may need to be rescheduled for a different day, depending on when the bus gets back from the shop. We will be visiting the newly re-opened Idaho History Museum on October 18, and we will be visiting the nursing home to sing to the residents. In Bible, we are studying the life of Elijah, and specifically the fact that we are all called by God. Elijah was called to give a certain message to King Ahab. After three years of famine, God proved that he is the true God, and called the people of Israel to return to him. He is also calling each of us to come to him. It is my prayer that each of my students accepts his call.

We are finishing our reading unit on heroes. The heroes we have studied this month include Charlie Horse (Ellen White's horse), Abe Lincoln, David (shepherd boy who became king of Israel), and Noah Webster. We will begin our new units next week!

Teacher Martha's Class

This week we have been studying sports this week. Our book of the week is 'Winners Never Quit'. It is about a girl who gave up every time she was not winning. To go along with the story, we practiced some sports skills such as catching and kicking. We watched some videos the girl who the book was written about, Mia Hamm. The kids really enjoyed watching her score winning goals. We also watched how a soccer ball is made. A lot of work goes into that process.

We are working on putting our numbers in order 1-100. The kids are doing very well at number recognition and putting them in order. We looked at adding this week too. The kids will pick it up pretty easy once we dive into it.

We studied the Bible story of the 4 friends who helped their friend who was lame. The kids reenacted the story with a blanket. They found out it quite tough and tiring to carry their friend (the smallest in class) around on a blanket and there were more than 4. They still don't quite understand the concept of a flat roof on a house...but they do understand the importance of Jesus' ability...that it the most important part!

Teacher Holly's Class

We are continuing to learn about choices. In our Bible story we read about 2 sisters. Martha was busy cooking and cleaning while Mary chose to spend time with Jesus. When Martha complained, Jesus said Mary was where she should be. A reminder to us that, though it is necessary to cook and clean, spending time with Jesus should be a priority.

Gak with styrofoam beads was not only a tactical experience, but color recognition as well.

We matched traffic signs, numbers to quantity as well as our names.

I traced their shoes then had them use the cut out to measure items around the room.
