

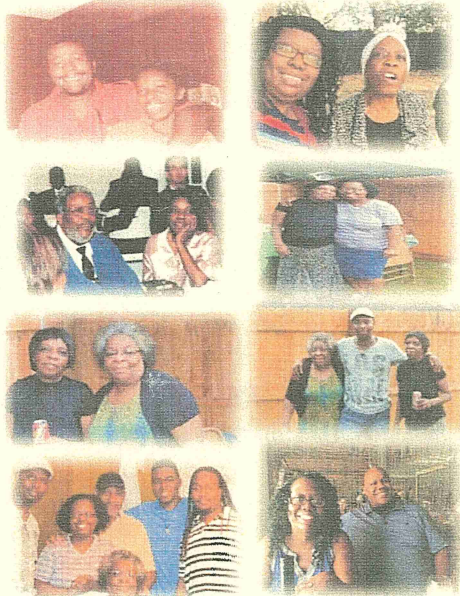


Acknowledgments
