orothy Lee Riley-Ponder was born in Savannah, Georgia on April 7, 1928, 95 years ago to Daisy Wallace-Riley and Charlie Riley. Her parents had 8 children (5 males and 3 females). She was the 2nd oldest child.

Mother Dorothy Ponder served as a loyal and faithful member of the United House of Prayer for All People in her teenage and early young adult years. One of her proud roles was serving the Late "Sweet Daddy" Grace as an altar girl. She relocated to Brooklyn, New York during her young adult age to assist her older sister in raising her children. While there, she was employed at a doll factory. Upon returning to Savannah, on December 30, 1955, she was united in Holy Matrimony to Elder Alvin Ponder for over 50 years. To this union, five children were born.

She later joined the Lighthouse Tabernacle under the leadership of the Late Bishop Ronald E. Brown. In 1974, she joined the Victory Drive Deliverance Temple, under the leadership of the late Bishop Luther C. Anderson and served faithfully for over 32 years. Mother Ponder was a member of the New Life Experience Church under the leadership of District Elder John P. Anderson, Sr. for nearly 17 years.


