> Robert Charles Taylor was born on December 31, 1928, in Dennison, Texas to his mother, Hester Sampson. He was the second child born in the family. He was raised surrounded by his brother, Sammy. They spent their childhood in the country. He enjoyed fishing, pecan packing, and spending time with nature.

> > Robert received his formal education by attending the Dennison Independent School District in the state of Texas. On January 3. 1946, he enlisted in the United States Air Force. While serving his country, Robert earned a World War II Victory Medal. He served with honor and distinction and was honorably discharged.

Robert was the proud father of Robert, Sammy, Billie, DeWayne, Victoria, and Ronald. He married, the former Rosalie Gomez on November 6, 1998, in Texas. They first met in Denver, Colorado.
