

A Time to Be Born: On November 19, 1931, Daniel (Bebe) Ellsberry was born in Birmingham, Alabama, one of seven children to the union of James W. and Florence Ellsberry.

A Time to Grow: Daniel was educated in the Birmingham City School System. He graduated from Parker High School, class of 1950. While in High School he fell in love with Jazz music and taught himself to play the saxophone. He was known as the school's "Southpaw" Quarterback. He also enjoyed playing "Sandlot" Baseball.
