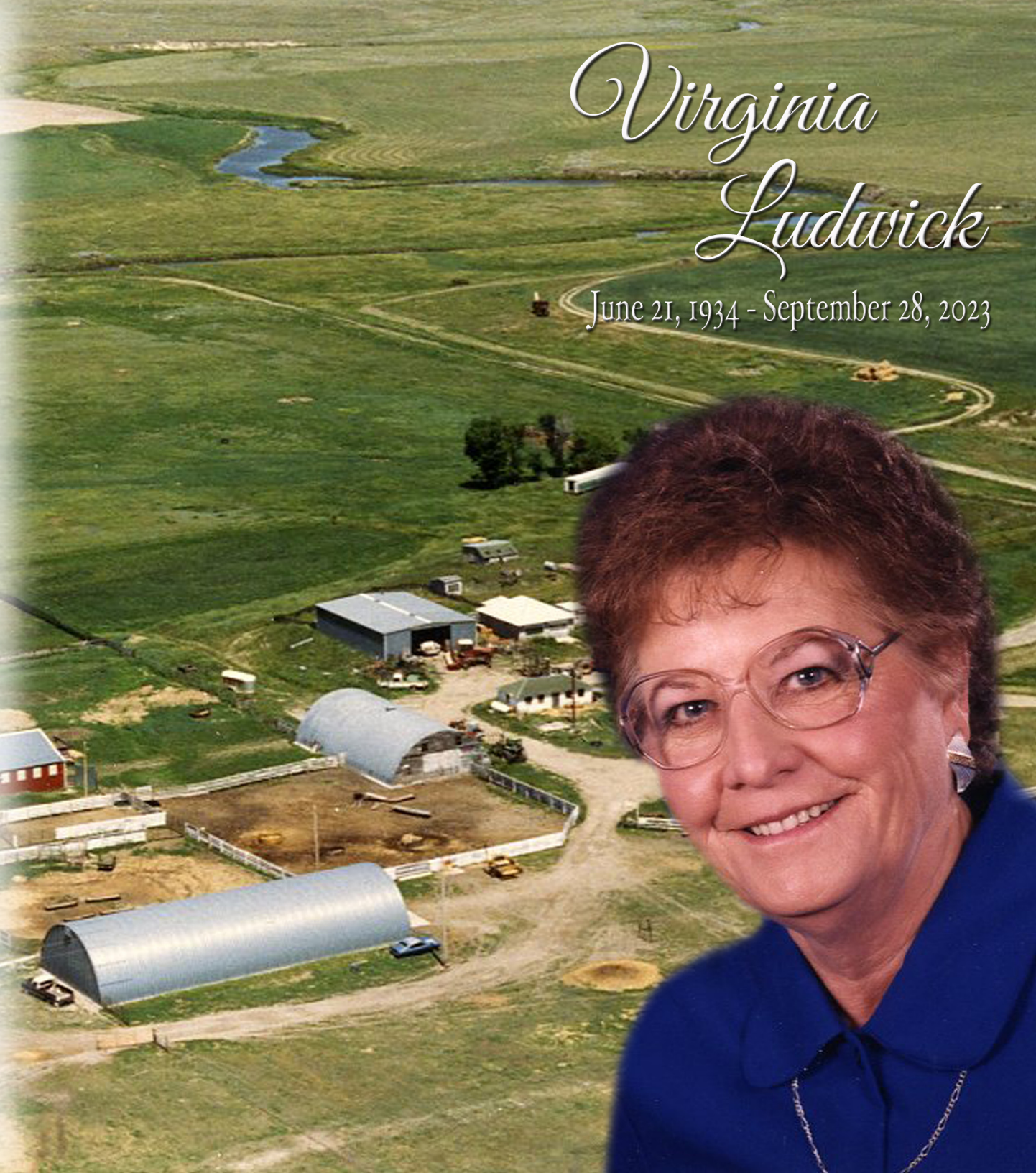


Virginia Lee Ludwick (Courtney)
