Roger Killian Hynnek was born in Mellen, WI, on November 25, 1934. He was the son of John and Anastasia (Heid) Hynnek. Roger's family moved to the Ortonville, MN, area in 1945, and he graduated from Ortonville High School in 1952. He joined the National Guard in 1953 where he got his military education at Fort Sill, OK. He retired as a major from the Guard on November 25, 1994.

Roger was united in marriage with Carol Jurgens on May 25, 1957, in Ortonville. They were blessed with five children. Roger worked as a milkman for North Star Dairy, was the district manager for American Family Insurance, owned and operated the Matador Supper Club, and was an owner/operator for a trucking company until he retired in 1996. Roger and Carol loved to travel and took several vacations with their family around the United States. Following retirement, they spent the winter months in California, Texas, and Arizona.

Roger was an avid outdoorsman. He hunted pheasants, ducks, and geese; he especially enjoyed bow-hunting deer. Family members were on the receiving end of his joy of the outdoors.
