The high cost of living has contributed to relationship breakdown for 1.8 million UK adults, according to the YouGov poll. The same God whose miracles are in the Bible is at work in 2024, and we can always trust in him.

Lord God, we know that those living in poverty are close to your heart. At the start of this new year, please be with all those who are struggling in mind, body and spirit.
