Did you know?

Did you know that one of the most important roles that local government plays in an emergency is the provision of local knowledge to emergency responders?

The importance of local knowledge has been a constant theme in major reviews and inquiries into the effectiveness of disaster response in Australia over the last ten years. Local Governments need to look at ways to increase local knowledge to enhance preparedness for emergencies and disaster events.

What is this project and how can it help?

The City of Rockingham is piloting an emergency preparedness support project within the area of Karnup.The intention is to collect information from owners and occupiers in the area and record it on an emergency register.

This register will be accessed by the City when considering emergency planning for the area; when supporting a response to an emergency in or around the location; and in recovery from a disaster event, should one occur.

You will also be provided with useful links to information that will help you plan your own actions in the event of an emergency.



How can you help?

How will you benefit?

Personal Information Collection Notice and Consent Form

Introduction

This notice explains the types of personal information we need to collect from you, why the City of Rockingham (City/We/Us) need to collect it and how it will be used.

Why do we need to collect your personal information?

The personal information we collect is necessary for us to provide you with the best possible service in the event of an emergency such as a bushfire.

What sort of information do we collect?

We only collect personal information that is necessary for the City to provide you with services and for the City to perform its functions. Some of this information will be sensitive information such as:

- contact details (name, address, phone, email);
- personal details including date of birth, gender, marital status, family structure;
- personal household information such as the number of occupants in your house, animals, equipment.

Who will have access to the information and how it will be kept?

Your personal and sensitive information will be kept in a secure and locked location to prevent unauthorised access. Information kept electronically will be protected by passwords and other security measures. The information will only be made accessible to those persons within the City who reasonably need the information in order to provide you with the services you require and to perform the City's functions.

How will the information be used?

The information will be used to:

- assess your needs and provide you with the services you require;
- enable communication with you in the event of an emergency such as a bushfire;
- evaluate the services being provided to you.

Who else might information be given to?

The City will not pass on your personal information to others except under the following circumstances:

- if required by Australian law or a court/tribunal order;
- deal with a serious or imminent threat to any person's health or safety or to public health and safety; or
- with your express written consent.

Your personal information may also be given to third parties for the purpose of providing you with appropriate services and assistance including:

- the WA Police Force
- the Department of Fire and Emergency Services.

What if you do not provide us with the information?

The City only collects the information necessary to provide you with the best possible service. Wherever practical, we will give you a choice as to whether you give us the information. However, a minimum amount of personal information will be necessary and without it, we may not be able to provide a service.



How can you gain access to your information and make changes if it is not accurate?

You have the right to see the personal information and to amend anything that is inaccurate, incomplete or out of date by contacting:
