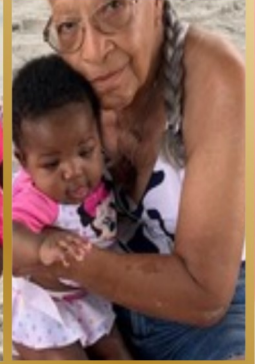
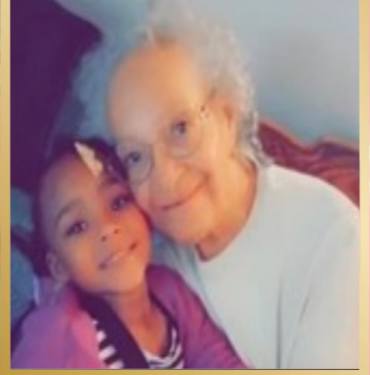


## *In Our Hearts*
