Beverly began her early education at Loyola Catholic School, and she completed her education in the Denver Public Schools System.

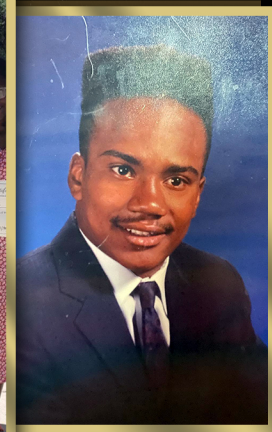
