

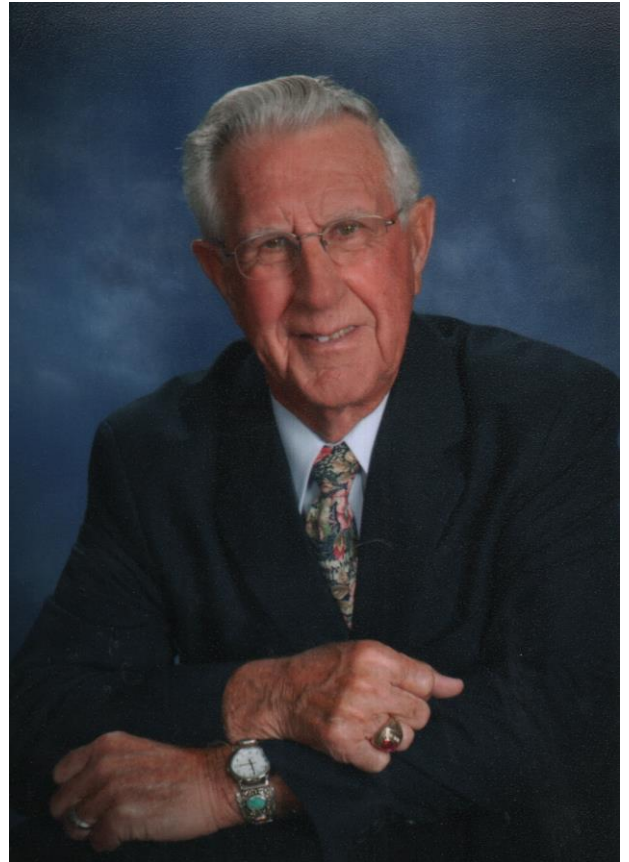
Remembering the Life Of
