

Weep Not For Me

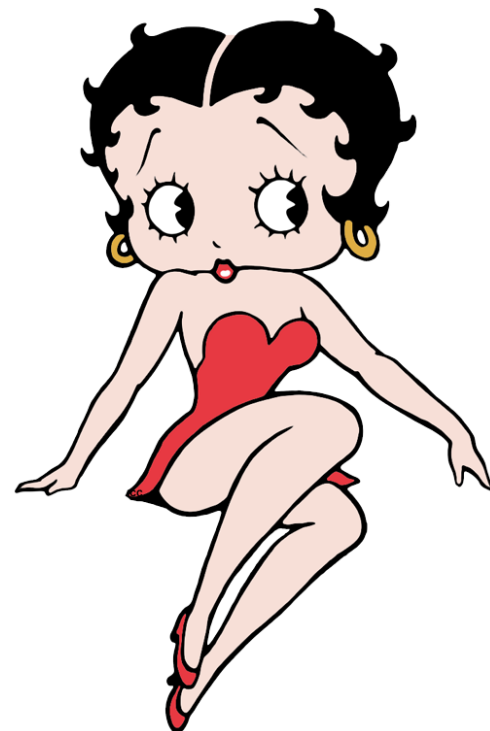
