The Principal Gifts Officer will advance the mission of the Rainforest Alliance through the engagement and solicitation of high-net-worth individual donors and prospects at the principal gifts level, gifts of \$500,000+, in close partnership with the Chief Executive Officer, Chief Development Officer, and Senior Director, Individual Giving. This includes managing and coordinating the identification, qualification, cultivation, solicitation, and stewardship of an assigned portfolio with the goal of significantly increasing revenue in support of the Alliance's ambitious Rainforest Alliance Vision 2030 strategy.

Founded in 1987, the Rainforest Alliance is an international non-profit organization working at the intersection of business, agriculture, and forests to make responsible business the new normal. The Rainforest Alliance is building an alliance to protect forests, improve the livelihoods of farmers and forest communities, promote their human rights, and help them mitigate and adapt to the climate crisis. As an alliance of farmers, forest communities, companies, and consumers, the Rainforest Alliance is committed to creating a world where people and nature thrive in harmony. By bringing diverse allies together, the Rainforest Alliance is making deep-rooted change on some of the most pressing social and environmental issues of our time. It is implementing proven and scalable solutions on the ground while testing innovative ways to drive change.

The best hope for a brighter, more resilient future is to embrace sustainability on a systemic and massive scale. Programs of the Rainforest Alliance focus on coffee, cocoa, tea, bananas, and many other important commodity sectors facing urgent environmental and social challenges. These sectors and landscapes have changed profoundly in the past 35 years. Building on all that it has learned, the Rainforest Alliance has redesigned its certification programs to raise its ambitions and amplify its impact, providing a clear path to a more resilient and inclusive future that is guided by the key principles of improving data management, context adaptability, shared responsibility, and continuous improvement.

The Principal Gifts Officer will

- build and manage a robust portfolio of donors and prospects with the capacity to make transformative gifts in their lifetime, including identification and qualification, cultivation, request for support, and prompt follow up, stewardship, and recognition;
- prepare donor, prospect, and event briefings for the Chief Executive Officer, Chief Development Officer, Senior Director, Individual Giving, and Board Committees;
- utilize systems and software to track and cultivate donors and prospects, including the donor database and wealth screening tools;
- provide regular analyses and reports to team members and Development leadership;
- maintain up-to-date revenue projections toward annual revenue goals;
- track and report relationship management activity using Salesforce;
- build and analyse reports in Salesforce to report progress against cultivation, stewardship, and fundraising goals; and
- develop and maintain strong collaborative working relationships with team members.

- self-motivation, self-sufficiency, and a drive to lead and collaborate with others to achieve success;
- a detail-oriented, strategic, and analytical mindset;
- a persuasive, outgoing, and confident approach to one's work with exceptional communication skills across platforms;
- the highest standards of personal and professional integrity;
- an ability to thrive as a team player and an affinity for building close, effective working relationships with a diverse group of stakeholders;
- excellent writing, editing, and verbal communication skills;
- flexibility and an ability to work well under tight deadlines; and
- proficiency in Microsoft Office Suite and development databases, preferably Salesforce, as well as experience managing complex projects using project management tools.

A bachelor's degree or an equivalent combination of education and experience and at least seven years of experience in development, with an emphasis on principal gift fundraising, is preferred for this position. Experience in an international conservation environment is desirable. The Rainforest Alliance will consider candidates with a broad range of backgrounds. If you are excited about this role and feel that you can contribute to the Alliance, but your experience does not exactly align with every qualification listed above, we encourage you to apply.

The salary range for this position is \$130,000 to \$150,000 (USD) annually. The Rainforest Alliance offers a comprehensive benefits package that considers its staff members' and their families' health, career development, and financial future.
