We will never forget her spirit, dedication, her loyalty, independence and That "Classy, Sassy" unconditional lovable mannerism she shared unselfishly.

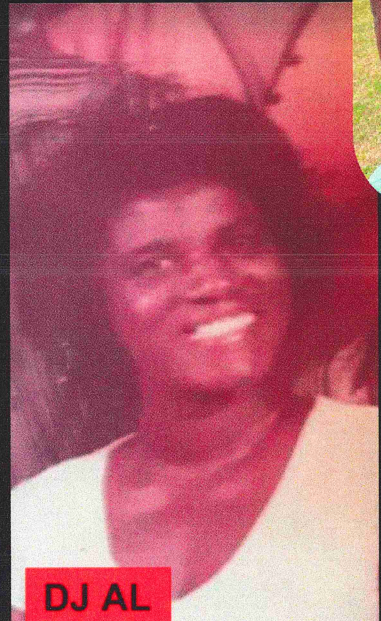
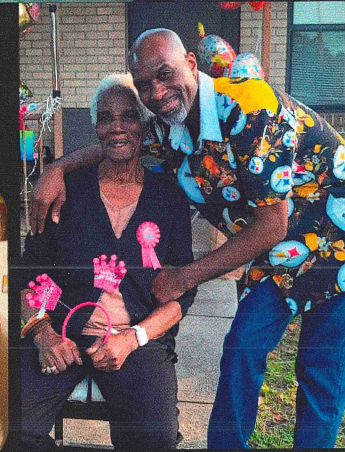
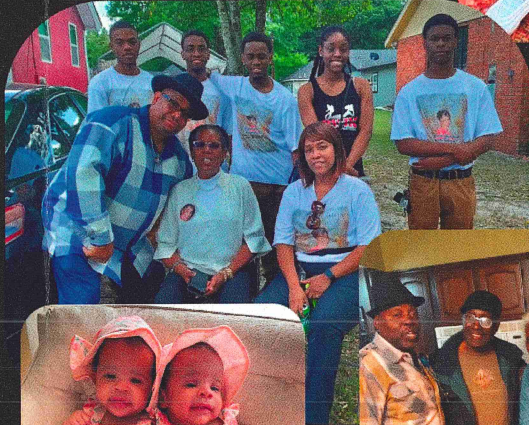
