
It will help them for their trip to Oshkosh, WI next summer.

# Classroom News

## Mrs. Davidson's Class

This week, grades 3-8 took their yearly ITBS tests. The schedule has been a bit different, but now we are done with testing and ready to get back to our regular classwork. Some students enjoy the variety of the testing schedule from the normal routine; others don't like testing week because of all the tests.

We started our next Bible unit this week. The students have not yet discovered whose life we will be learning about, but let's see if you can guess - he was a prophet of Israel during the reign of Ahab.

## Teacher Martha's Class

This week we read a cute book, One Smile. It all started with one smile from a young girl and showed how it started a chain reaction of good deeds. It also came full circle. A good reminder of the impact of a smile.

We have been working on number recognition and counting. The kids did wonderful identifying the numbers and correctly placing the correct number of items.

We are almost done with the alphabet review pages and will be diving deeper into proper writing and sounds of each letter and then put words together.

## Teacher Holly's Class

This week we began to learn about CHOICES, the "C" of CREATION Kids curriculum. Each letter represents things that help us be Happy Healthy Creation Kids.

Jonah was the topic of our Bible story. Everyone agreed that Jonah made a bad choice by trying to hide from God. The good news is that he also choose to listen and obey after a few days in the BIG fish. Even God uses time out when needed.

Art and writing went hand in hand again. First we covered several papers with paint. When it dried, we used our pincer grip to rip the paper and create something else.

Math was about measurements. Placing them in order of shortest to tallest. We also worked on recognizing numbers 1-10 and matching quantities.

I started reading "Have you filled your bucket today" referring to the idea that when we are kind and helpful we fill other's bucket. But when we are mean and hurtful, we are bucket dippers.
