

## Squash Australia Participation Memorandum – General Update Q3 2018

## 1. Community Engagement Coordinators (CEC)

From the 1<sup>st</sup> of June, our four new CECs began in their roles. Squash Australia is excited to welcome our new staff to the team:

## 2. Participation Program Updates

<u>Pop Up Squash</u> – The CECs are creating a 2018/19 Pop Up Squash Activation Plan to bring the program to multiple events across the country. The ultimate aim is to involve clubs and centres nearby to engage with their local community and raise Squash's profile within the area.

<u>Play Move Learn</u> – With the opening of the new Carrara facility on the Gold Coast, we are currently looking to hire personnel to coordinate the pilot Play Move Learn program at the centre. We are also currently developing a website for the program.

## 3. Sporting Schools Update

The packages for OzSquash have been modified on the Sporting Schools website for Term 3. We have chosen to differentiate between a Basic and Premium Equipment Kit for teachers.
