Elijah "Eli" Walker Sr., was born to Lincoln and Rodell (Howard) Walker on March 11, 1933, in Yahola, Oklahoma, he was the fifth of nine children. He attended Sugar Creek Elementary School and Morton High School. At the age of twenty-three, he joined the military serving two years in the United States Army.

Eli later moved to Kansas City, Missouri where he met Erma Marie Lindsey. On June 4, 1960, they were married and to this union, six children were born.

Elijah Walker became a member of Calvary Worship Center International, in Kansas City, Missouri under the leadership of Pastor J.D. Sherman. There he served faithfully for over twenty years, playing the organ during praise and worship, and was looked upon as the Elder of the Church.

Elijah enjoyed spending his time going fishing at the lake and repairing cars and electronics. He was a skillful man, a "selftaught" mechanic, electrician, and plumber. He was a kindhearted and giving man, who loved the Lord. He was not afraid of death because he had a strong faith in Christ. He was ready for the day the Lord called him home.

> I wish so much you wouldn't cry The way you did today; While thinking of the many things We didn't get to say.


I know how much you loved me, As much as I love you, And each time that you think of me I know you'll miss me too;
