soul:

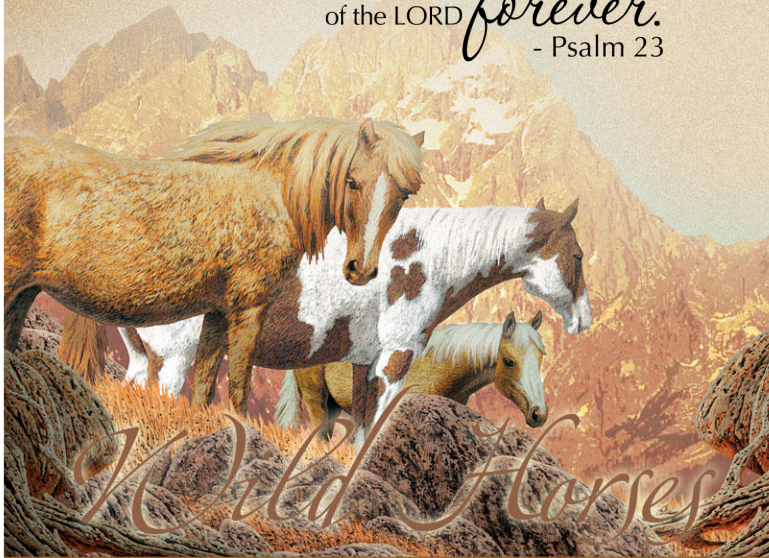
He leadeth me in the paths of righteousness




In Loving Memory of
