André accepted Christ on February 13, 2024.

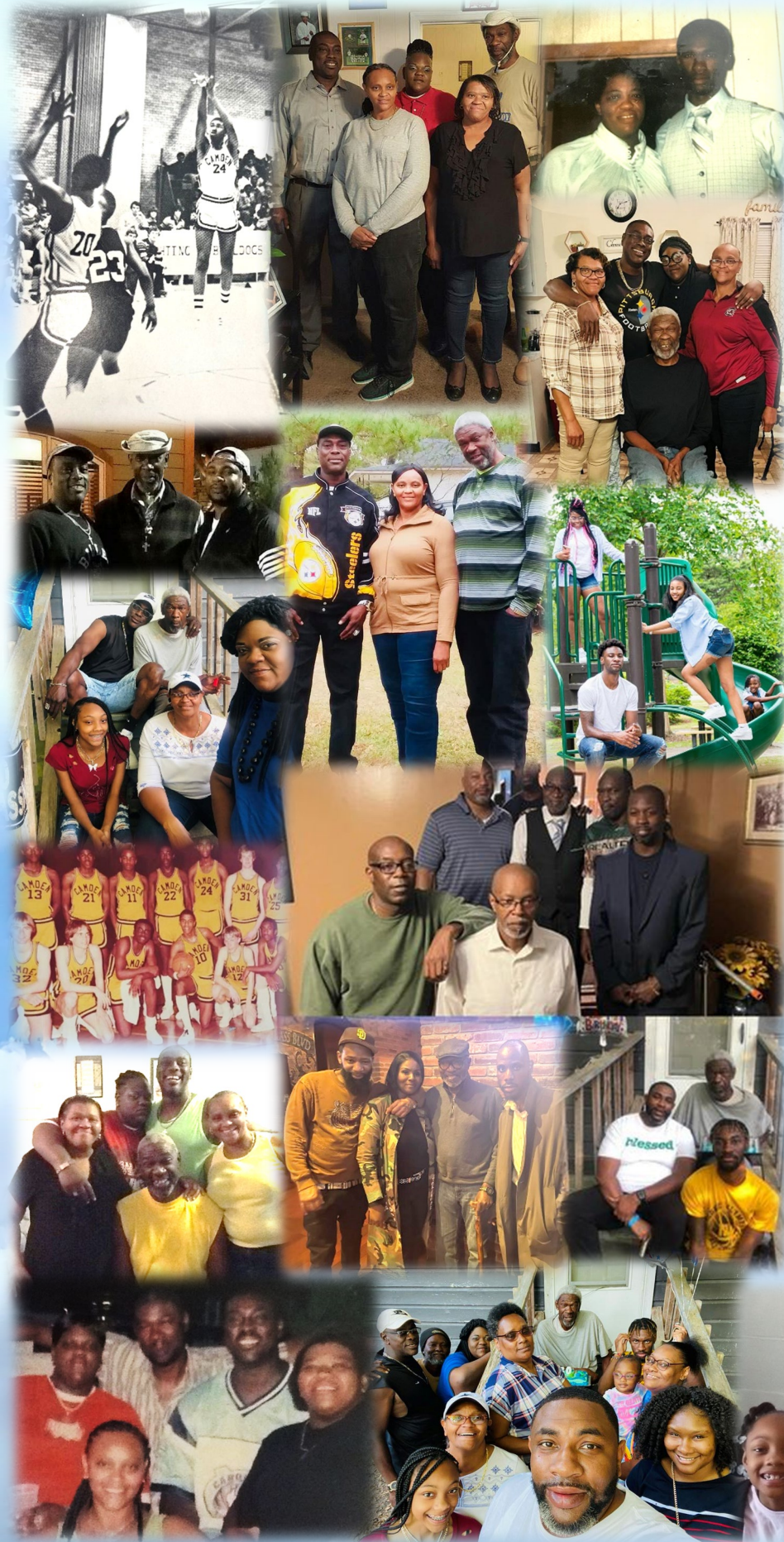
André battled with mental illness for thirty years of his life. He fought an amazing fight. He never gave up and finished his course.
