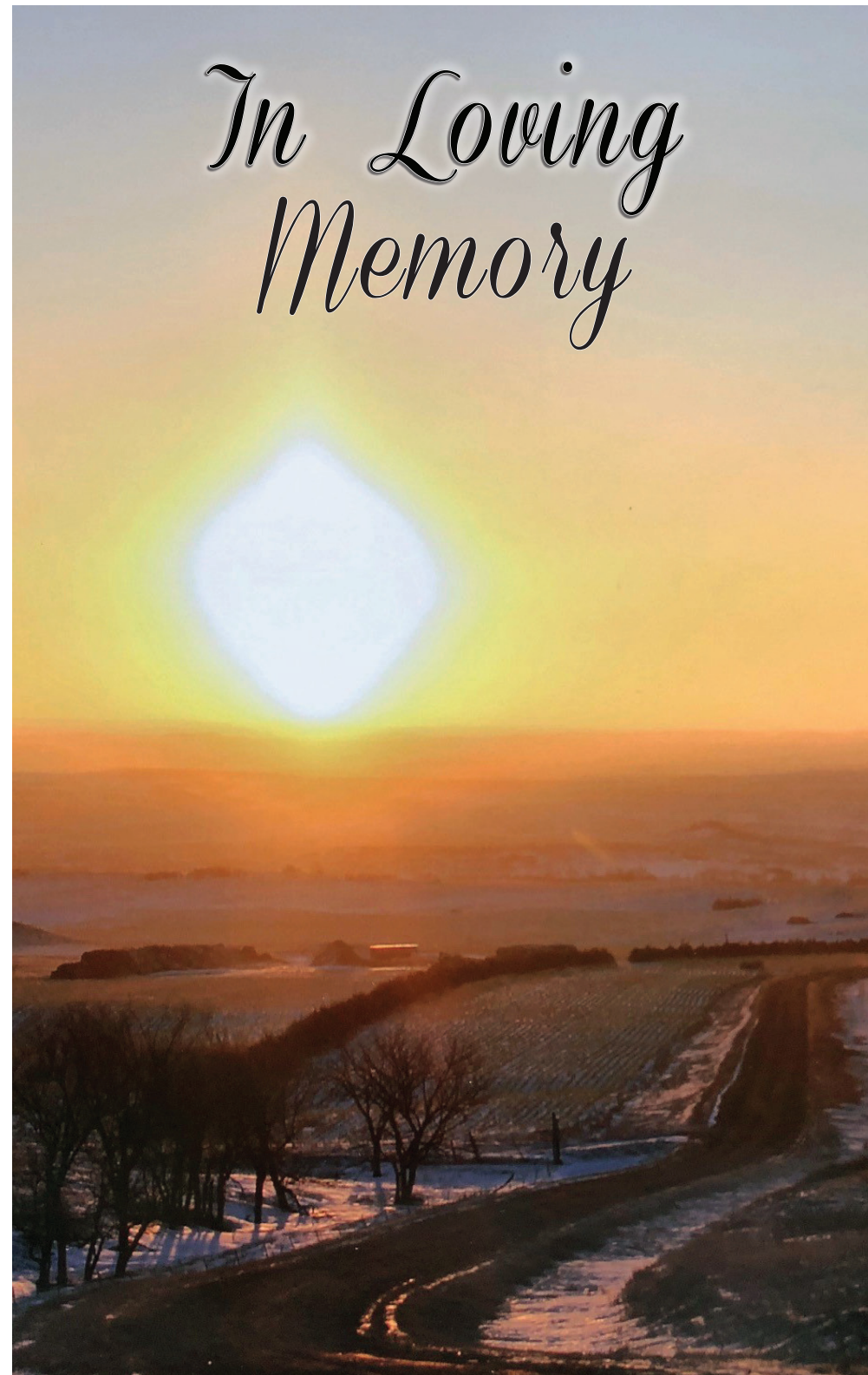
and I will listen to you.
