

Eulogy

Early Life

Crispus Nthale Mulu was born on February 5th, 1971 in Machakos County, Kenya to the late Morris Mulu Kioko and Agnetta Katiti Lonzi. He was the last born amongst six siblings, with 1 brother and 4 sisters. He was raised in Kasikeu, in Sultan Hamud.

Education

Crispus completed secondary education at Kasikeu High school with "O" level and attended Mumbuni High School to complete his A-Level, and moved thenNairobi. In the US, Crispus enrolled at Kennesaw State University where he earned dual degrees, in International Business and International affairs in 2016. He later enrolled in a Master of Law program at Seattle University and was set to graduate in May 2024.

Family

Crispus met Stella, his lovely wife in 1997 at Nairobi Lighthouse Church. They served together and were a part of the same young adult Christian community: focused on prayer, worship, and fellowship. They got married on November 20th 1999, in Nairobi. Their best man and Maid of honor were their close friends, Peter and Lucy Gichuki. They celebrated their 24th anniversary this past November. They were blessed with their first child Lily Grace Nthale in 2002. In December of the same year, after the passing of his sister Damaris Nzuki, Crispus, and Stella decided to adopt her four children, Sharon, Eric, and Kennedy and the late Stephen Nzuki. They later had two more children of their own, Tiffanie (2008) and Baraka (2013).

Faith

Crispus was a deeply devoted Christian from an early age, having given his life to Christ in High school. Later, he moved to the city, and found Nairobi Lighthouse Church, where grew in faith and served in various ministries. He lived out the Christian calling to take care of the needy, particularly Orphans and Strangers. He clothed, fed, counseled, and sheltered refugees in his home for many years. As a father, he led his family every night in bible reading and prayer, and ensured his family attended Church every Sunday. In the USA, he was active member of World Harvest Church serving as an usher, and participated in the men's fellowship & outreaches to spread the Gospel.

Illness

Crispus initially fell ill in March 2022 after losing a significant percentage of his kidney function, the same month he received the COVID-19 booster shot. This led to health complications and multiple hospitalizations throughout the year, leading to kidney dialysis. He continued dialysis treatment and significantly improved in health, even getting ready to return to work. However, during the last week of March, he suddenly became weak and was rushed to the hospital for treatment. On March 31, 2024, Crispus went home to be with the Lord.

Legacy

Crispus left a legacy of love through action. Whatever he sought to do, he it did wholeheartedly as unto the Lord. His legacy resonates in the lives he touched, the communities he uplifted, and the faith he fervently lived out. He will be missed and cherished by his family, friends, community, and all who knew & loved him.










FOREVER IN OUR HEARTS
