From Pastor's Desk

The scripture for today is **Luke 2:11**

"For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord."

This message, which was delivered by an angel to shepherds in the fields with their flocks, was the message that mankind had been waiting to hear since the fall in the Garden of Eden.
