She was the daughter of a devoted military father, which led to a childhood filled with travel. However, she spent most of her formative years in St. Paul, where she graduated from St. Joseph's Academy with the Class of 1958.

Kathy met the love of her life, Terry Oakes, in 1957 during a blind date for the prom, a serendipitous encounter that would spark a lifelong partnership. The couple exchanged vows on January 3, 1959, at the Church of St. Mark's in St. Paul, marking the beginning of their family life together in the house that Terry built. A devoted homemaker for many years, Kathy nurtured her family with unwavering love and support.

In 1986, Kathy returned to education, attending the University of Minnesota-Morris, where she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology in 1990. This accomplishment led to a fulfilling career as a social worker with Big Stone County Family Services, culminating in her role as the Director of Social Services at Northridge Nursing Home in Ortonville. She also worked with children in the Emotional Behavioral Disorder (EBD) room at Ortonville School until her retirement in 2005.

A woman of deep faith, Kathy devoted herself to her church community at St. John's Catholic Church in Ortonville.
