Carderock Springs Citizens' Association 21 September 2015 CSCA Minutes CSCA Board Meeting

Artis Appeal (discussion led by Bill Moore, VP CSCA)

Jack Orrick recused himself from the discussion about the Artis Alzheimer Center.

Bill Moore provided an update on the Zoning Examiners decision on the Artis Senior Living (Alzheimer's) facility, to be located on River Road opposite the entrance to Carderock Springs Drive. The project was approved with 18 conditions, including one regarding traffic safety. Each year Artis Development must provide a safety traffic update on the River Road Artis driveway intersection to the Zoning Examiner. Technical staff will evaluate the data independently. Anne Carlson (as a private citizen) filed an appeal to the decision. The appeal was posted on the CS-chat.

Bill mentioned the focus of the board is to work towards improving the safety of the intersection for all drivers and pedestrians; this will be done by the Traffic Safety Committee (a subcommittee of the CSCA board). Attendees were invited to participate in this subcommittee. The subcommittee will analyze potential safety measures that could be used at this intersection. The subcommittee would like to work with Artis to find safety mitigation measures.

The ensuing discussion ranged from traffic issues to the broader zoning issues. Jaime Manzano also filed an appeal with a focus on the change of the area from being single-family residential to multiple-family residential and commercial dwellings. Catherine Remijan noted the additional of a turning lane for the Quarry Springs condominium project may cause more problems for traffic on river Road. She is against the Artis development.

Eric Nothman noted that the exception for the Quarry Springs condominium project included language that the exception granted for the project should not be used when making decisions for other developments, and that a park was to be constructed as part of the agreement. Eric would like to oppose the Artis development based upon zoning changes, not just safety issues.

Scott Wilets asked if there was a traffic plan included in the proposal from Artis, ho would like to see the drawing.

Some attendees expressed the view that the board should either appeal or support your appeal. The board did not vote whether to support the appeal. Bill reiterated that the goal of the CSCA board is to ensure safety at the intersection. He would like to solicit input on traffic issues independent of the Artis development decision.

Jack Orrick joined the meeting.

1) Approval of August meeting minutes

The August Meeting minutes were approved as distributed with the correction of a typographical error on page 4.

2) Treasurer's Report

Rob Gorman provided the Treasurer's report for August.

- A separate checking account was created for C3
 - o The grant from the Chesapeake Bay Conservation will be \$12000 in total, to be received in installments. Currently \$7100 has been received.
- Monies collected from dues via PayPal (~\$580) will be transferred to the checking account.
- Rob has revised/updated the directory entries and sent the file to Barbara Ames.
 - o Rob will create a few additional listings to be included in the directory and transfer these to Barbara.

The Treasurer's report was approved as presented.

3) Board Protocol Discussion

Jack will create an agenda for each board meeting in advance of the meeting. He would like to follow the agenda at each meeting.

Increased communication on CSCA-sponsored events is needed. Board members are encouraged to attend these events. There should be board members at each event.

4) Discussion of Tree Removal Consultant to the Board

Jack may have identified a resident to be the tree consultant. Lisa Wilcox Deyo will speak with this person as will Jack. These conversations should occur prior to the next CSCA meeting. Scott Wilets is familiar with this person and stated that a common sense approach should be taken regarding tree removal. Lisa has been involved with the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) on some larger projects in Carderock Springs that involve tree removal and/or involve drainage or landscape issues. The hope would be that this type of involvement would continue. Scott supported the nomination of this individual as the tree consultant.

It was suggested that an additional question be added to the ARC renovation application form asking if trees would be removed during the construction process.

ACTION: Jack to meet with potential tree consultant.

ACITON: Scott Wilets to review ARC application form and determine if a question regarding tree removal should be added.

5) Directory Update

Barbara Ames has worked with Melissa Wilets on the neighborhood directory. Melissa's design that was used for the Carderock Springs home tour will be used as the directory cover. Barbara will request a quote from Indigo Ink on printing costs. Indigo was used for the Home Tour brochures. Barbara is to

send all files for the directory to Melisa for compilation and then printing. Mary Lou Shannon is currently proof reading the directory. A decision was made to hand deliver the directories to all neighborhood mailboxes. This may be done at the same time as the next newsletter.

ACTION: Barbara to send files to Melissa for the directory.
ACTION: Barbara to request quote for printing the directories from Indigo Ink.
