Claude Edward Williams of Logan, WV, departed this life on Monday, January 23, 2023, at Good Shepherd Community Nursing Center in Phelps, Kentucky just 2 days after his 86th birthday. He was born on January 21, 1937, in Logan, WV and was the son of the late Edmond and Odessa (Hollingshead) Williams.

In addition to his parents, Claude was preceded in death by his wife, Bettie (Norah) Williams; three sisters, Geraldine Prier, Wanda Johnson, and Carolyn Cook; and one brother, Willie Driver. Claude left Logan in 1955 to travel the country before settling in Boston, MA where he was a member of the Black Panther Party. Claude and Bettie relocated to Detroit, MI and married in 1970. He worked at Ford, where he was involved in the UAW and organized community work. Claude was very active in politics, the Civil Rights Movement, and the Rainbow Coalition. He participated in the March on Washington for many years. Claude retuned to Logan in 1980. In 1984, he served as President of Logan County for Jesse Jackson for President. In 2009, Claude was appointed as an Honorary Member of President Barack Obama's "Kitchen Cabinet".

A resident of Cora, Claude was a member of the Logan County Minority Open Forum and was instrumental in getting Barrett's Playground built. Claude was an active member of St. Philips Missionary Baptist Church for many years before moving to Cole Street Missionary Baptist Church. Claude sang in the church choir, served as a deacon, Sunday School teacher, and was a member of the Lavman's Board to name a few. He served as the Publicity Chairman and Historian for the Aracoma High School Alumni Association. Claude was awarded the Greatest of Great Academic Historians by Aracoma High School. In 2008 he was inducted as a Lifetime Member of the West Virginia All Black Schools Sports and Academic Hall of Fame. He served on the Chief Logan Park and Museum Board of Directors. He held many roles at the Logan County Court House before retiring in 2010.

Those left to cherish his loving memory include his children: Kimberly Brown, Curtis Labitue, Lewis Labitue and Angelique Williams Anderson; nine grandchildren: Ebonie, Shantelle, Vanessa, Veronica, Frankie, Lewis Jr., Bianca, Treajour and Dante; eight great-grandchildren; one brother: Lovell Williams; four sisters: Betty Frifeldt, Jacqueline Branham, Barbara Jean Price and Valeria Hardy; a host of nieces, nephews, family, and friends.
