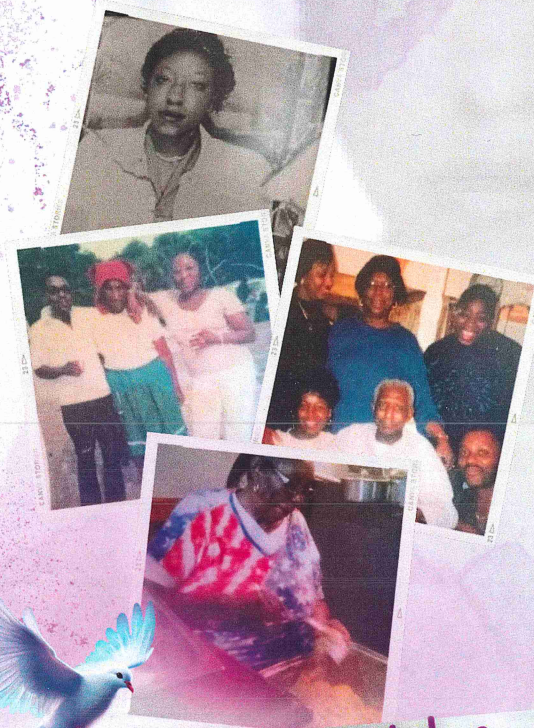
Profile Of Life
