

Obituary

Rosa Louise Benjamin, daughter of the late Paul and Louise Blount, fell asleep in death on July 1, 2024, at the age of 84. Her family migrated to Mount Vernon, New York where she attended Edison High School. She then met Samuel Benjamin and married on June 21, 1958.

Rosa went on to receive her certification as a nursing assistant and later worked as a secretary. Her career of choice quickly changed after coming in contact with Jehovah's Witnesses at her place of employment and through the door-to-door ministry.
