Celebrating the Life of Betty Jean (Becker) Carlson

Betty Jean Carlson, daughter of Tobias B. and Ida (Koehn) Becker was born July 19, 1933, in McPherson County, KS. She was the youngest of four children born to the Becker family. In the early days, the family lived in a one-room home. Betty attended the Moundridge schools through the ninth grade.

On July 26, 1950, Betty was united in marriage to Robert Dean Carlson in Perham, MN. The trip to Perham was originally planned as a fishing trip, but Bob and Betty decided to also tie the knot in an impromptu wedding ceremony! This union was blessed with the birth of three children, Dennis, Steven, and Diane.

Bob and Betty built a home together in the 1950's where they would raise their family. They did most of the work themselves and were very proud of that fact. Bob was responsible for building and maintaining the home, and Betty made sure

everything was clean and orderly. They were a perfect team! Betty also made sure that the family relationships were solid and that everyone's needs were well taken care of. Betty never hired babysitters to look after the children. Instead, she always made sure to alternate her work schedule opposite of Bob's so that someone could be with them at all times.


For many years she was a cook at the Hickory Manor Nursing Home, which was owned and operated by Betty's parents. Her most important job, however, was being a dedicated homemaker, and her German roots and values made her one of the best moms you could ever ask for!

Betty always looked forward to the family vacations each summer. Planning and saving up money for the vacations always began months in advance. Many fond memories were made on those summer trips. The family was often accompanied by other relatives and friends as well.

After nearly 59 years of marriage, Bob preceded her in death on July 7, 2009.

Betty was a member of the First Baptist Church and longtime member of the V.F.W. Auxiliary.

Betty entered into eternal rest on Wednesday,



November 9, 2022, at her home in McPherson. She was eighty-nine.
