Rhea was always willing to make her family smile. It was not uncommon to find her enjoying lake activities in or on Clitherall Lake with family and friends. Throughout Rhea's life there was rarely a time where she didn't have a dog or two by her side. Her love for her pets kept a grin on her face and warmth in her heart. Rhea was an avid gardener and enjoyed working in her beautiful flower gardens. She was always happy to share her love and knowledge of flowers and plants with anyone who asked. Rhea also spent her time knitting, maple syruping, quilting, attending the Minnesota State fair annually with friends and family; as well as, and traveling with her husband Bruce. Together they crossed the ocean and visited family in Norway and Sweden. The two took a cruise with cousins to and through the Panama Canal. They visited history in Boston, MA. Rode an Amtrak train through the upper United States with friends to visit friends in Seattle, WA. They also made stops in Las Vegas, NV and Catheys Valley, California to visit family.

Rhea was very involved in her Church community, chaperoning a youth group trip to the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness, serving in the Mary circle, coordinating the Church plant sale fundraiser, hosting the Church Choir Picnic and assisting with the fall Friendship dinner, among other activities. Rhea further enjoyed spending a few months with Bruce, in Arizona at her winter home and catching up with family and friends there. Wherever she went, Rhea made lifelong friends with whom she was able to grow and love until her final days. Family and friends found Rhea to be a wonderful person who was always there when needed. She was very kindhearted and loved by many. Over the last year she fought a brief and swift battle with pancreatic cancer. Rhea represented genuine love, humor and kindness for us all. She had a strong faith in God. It is with both joy and relief that her family knows she has gone home to her Lord and savior, Jesus Christ.

Preceding Rhea in death were her parents Ernest and Marlys Weber, sisters AnMarie Weber and Mona Johnson, brother Ernest Edmund (Jay) Weber II, and step-daughter Elise Larson.
