All School Spring Program!



Mrs. Davidson's Class

We had a good first week back after spring break, and now we are ready for the race to the end. Thank you to all who came for Parent-Teacher Conferences this week. It is always a blessing to talk to you about your kids. It is wonderful to have so many parents who are involved in their children's education.

The next big thing on the calendar is next week's Spring Program on Tuesday. That morning will be our science fair, so each student will need to have their project here and set up in the gym at the beginning of the day. Throughout the morning, the judges will call the students out to discuss their projects. We will leave the projects up so they can be viewed during the evening's program. Student artwork will also be displayed. We will have a spaghetti dinner beginning at 6:00 Tuesday evening, with a bake sale for dessert. We also plan to have a silent auction. Donations from dinner, the bake sale, and the auction will go to the upper grade class trip next month. After dinner, starting about 6:45, will be our program. All of the students in preschool thru 8th grade have a part in the program. Afterwards, you will be free to spend more time viewing the science projects and artwork. We expect the evening to be over by 7:30 or 8:00. If you have anything to donate for the silent auction, please let me know by Monday.

In Bible this week we started a unit about Jesus as a guide, which focuses on his temptation in the wilderness following his baptism. We have spent some time reading the story and talking about Satan and temptation. We also started the unit by discussing guides and what they do, when they are needed, and what sort of characteristics and qualifications they need. We are all thankful that God is a faithful guide and that Jesus came to show us the way!

One other thing, we will be going to Gem State Adventist Academy on May 9 for Track and Field Day. There is a \$2 fee for each student to participate in that event, which I need to collect ahead of time and send in to the organizers. Teacher Martha's Class

We went back in time this week with our story. We read a book about a family's journey on the Oregon Trail. Then we watched a couple short videos to help us gain a bit more understanding about life on the trail. The kids didn't grasp the amount of time that it took them to cross, but they did understand that their shoes wore out from walking so far. We used the distance from their home to the school to help gain an idea of how far they would walk each day. I cannot imagine how they completed that journey. I don't think I would have it in me.

Our classroom gained 4 new sets of mini erasers. As a teacher I imagined using them for counting, sorting, graphing, etc. The kids have done most of those things, but added building. They have come up with some really neat designs and creations with them. I love how they can take an activity to a new level when allowed to explore...what they do best!

In Bible we stayed with our theme of moving (Oregon Trail) and followed Abram and his move. God told him to move and he packed up his family and moved. And his move was so he could worship God the way he wanted. God helps us out of sticky situations, but we have to be Abrams and always be willing to follow God's word.
