She shared a special closeness with her sister, brother, cousins, and other family members.

The family eventually relocated to Denver, Colorado, where she graduated from Manual High School in 1960. She furthered her education by attending Neosho County Community College in Chanute, Kansas from 1974-1976 she earned her Licensed Practical Nurse Certification (LPN). In 1989, Patricia and her daughter, Shaun took a Phlebotomy class together at Emily Griffith and received their Certification.

On May 2, 1988, Patricia united in holy matrimony to Mittis Lee Chapman in Denver, Colorado. They first met at the 40 Minute Cleaners in the Five Points area of Denver, They were a loving and devoted couple, who loved cooking together. Their specialty was peach cobbler and greens. Holiday dinners at the Chapmans was the place to be. They also enjoyed the yearly trips to Mississippi to visit family.



Her co-worker, Sarah Rainey remembers them having lunch together, conversing on everything. They didn't always agree but she was a true friend and confidant. She loved her job and took great care of the patients in her charge.
