

His hobbies included singing with his brothers, you could always catch him humming a good oldies tune especially during his DIY projects at home. He loved hanging with the fellas and cracking jokes. He was the master jokester. He was one of the best in shuffle boarding and putting together model cars. He loved sports but was an all time Eagles fan and collected whatever fan gear he could get his hands on. He loved NASCAR and drag racing, and he frequently visited Atco to catch a good race.

Willis had a giving heart. He would give his last with a smile and a good lecture/wisdom to go along with it, and don't forget that black and white book. He had quite a few all-time sayings, some of them were... "OH BOY!!!"
