Mrs. Davidson's Class

We are all excited about spring break next week. We will return to school on April 1 (no joke!). On April 3-4 we will have early release for Parent/Teacher conferences. They are clearing land for farming and doing VBS with the kids at night. They are staying at an orphanage and so we learned what that means and who lives there.
