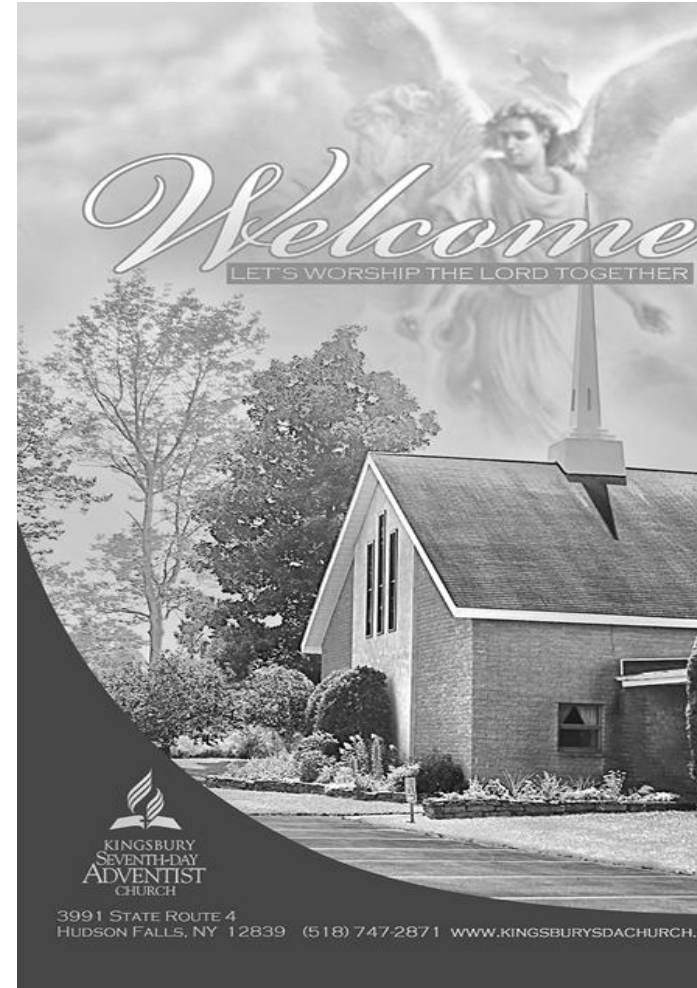

How to Hear the Voice of God

Silent Messages

We don't just listen with our ears.
We listen with our eyes, with our hearts.
That's how we discern promptings, people, and pain. We don't just read Scripture. We read desires and doors and dreams. Scripture is made up of actual words, and it "is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness."
But God also speaks via body language: His body, the church. I call it the language of people. And God speaks through different tones of voice, including the language of desires and the language of pain. But when it comes to interpreting body language and tone, we desperately need the gift of discernment. (to be continued)
