
## **GOD'S GARDEN**

She entered nurses training at St. Luke's in Sioux City. While in nurses training, she went on a blind date and met the love of her life, a tall slim airman named Jim Dunnam. They were married in June of

1954. Pat's mother and her aunt Minnie disapproved of the marriage and said it would never last because Jim was in the military. They traveled extensively for over 20 plus years and when it was time to retire from the military, they decided to buy the family farm where Pat was born.

Pat's childhood included being involved in all aspects of farm life. She excelled in home economics in school and was always busy cooking for large groups of farm help.

4-H years saw her winning a purple ribbon at the South Dakota State Fair for her cherry pie. Since that time, she has been known far and wide for her pies. Her special friend, Luke Boyer, will miss her pies as well as her friendship. Her fresh baked goods at farmers market always sold out. Homemade jams and jellies were another specialty.

Pat worked as an LPN, Home Health Aide, and Hospice volunteer. She was honored at the state level as Hospice Volunteer of the Year. She also enjoyed writing cards for birthdays and anniversaries for members of their church.

She was an avid writer, composing short stories and poems. She loved writing letters and had many pen pals over the years. Pat died on Thursday morning, February 16, 2023 at the Sanford Heart Hospital in Sioux Falls, South Dakota at the age of 88. Her daughters and 2 granddaughters were present to see God call her home.
