5th & 6th Grade Mrs. Janet Lopez



This week is 5/6 grade we continue to study the book of Daniel. We learned about the prophet Jeremiah and the difficult tug of war that went on in his heart as Jesus called him to service. We participated in a tug of war activity.

In Math this week the 5th graders worked on multiplying fractions and the 6th grade continued measurement conversion. The 6th grade will have a math test over measurement conversion next Tuesday.

In Science the students are learning about safety. They drew maps of the school and marked places where accidents have occurred and we talked about how to make school and home safer. Students also worked in groups to play a game where students drew an illness out of a cup and acted it out. Their teammates tried to identify the illness and give steps they should take if they have those symptoms including which health professional they should see.

Social Studies has focused on the 1700's and the process of forming a new government, including writing the constitution and the Articles of Confederation.


In Language Arts we are finding parts of speech in sentences. We are focused on Adverbs and prepositions this week. "Socks" is the name of the book we are reading, a story of a cat living the good life in a nice family until the new baby arrives.

Remember to study for vocab, MV, spelling and 6th grade for a math test. A science test over first aid and safety will be given next Thursday. Remind your child to study the chapter 6 review and vocab words for that section.
