Obituary

James Stewart was born on October 8, 1937, in

Savannah, Georgia to the late Addie and Benjamin Stewart.

He graduated from A. E. Beach High School, and shortly thereafter, enlisted in the United States Army.

Because he loved God and people, he served tirelessly at First Friendship Baptist Church for over 50 years. His service included Director of the choir, President of the Trustee Board, and Sunday School Teacher. He was also ordained as a Deacon in 1982.

His service extended outside of the church walls to his community, which included an active Alumni of Frank Callen Boys and Girls Club, President of the St. Pius Community Resource Center, Director of the Savannah Concert Choral, and he coached several softball teams.

He retired from Kem Distributing after many years of employment. However, because he was so active, he worked a few more years driving school buses for the Savannah-Chatham County Board of Education.
