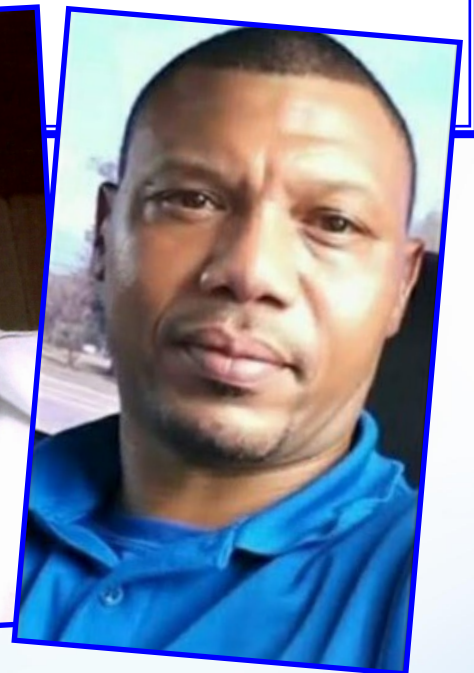
Kendrick played High School Football, Basketball and Track where he was the Pole Vault District Champion. He graduated from Adamson High School in 1995.
