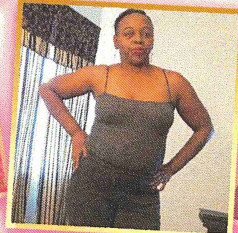
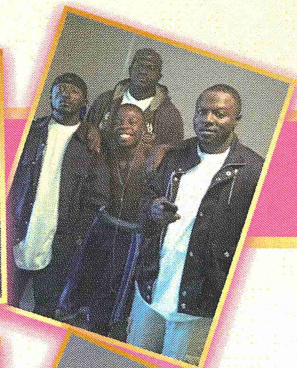
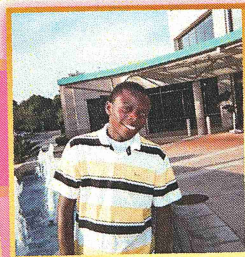


A Wonderful Grandmother

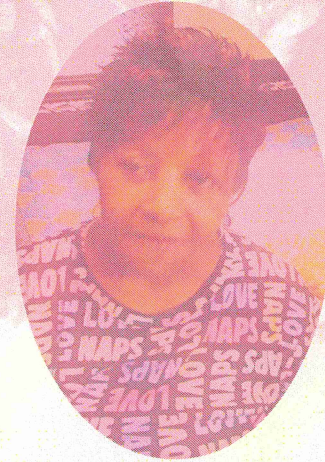

Just to hear her say

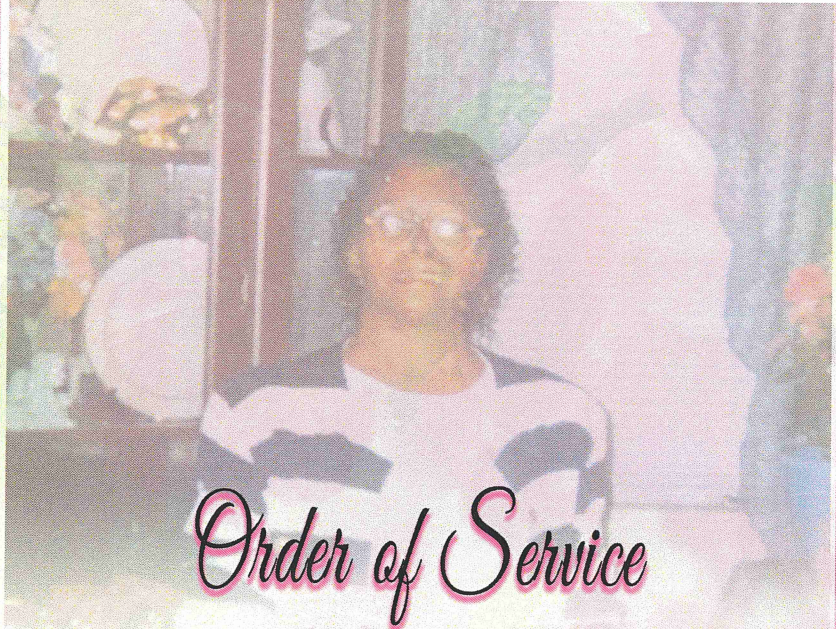
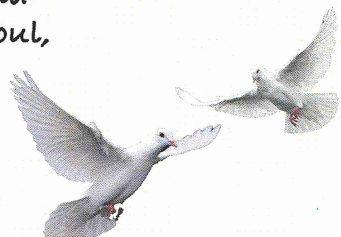
It's funny how in life it seems
